Bright Start - Islington

Islington Council offers a variety of resources and services to support healthy eating for children under 5. Visit the Bright Start Islington information page to learn more about:



- How to join a <u>Family Kitchen programme</u>: Get inspiration for creating delicious and nutritious meals your little one will love.
- Local <u>children's centres</u> and support groups: Connect with other parents and carers, learn about healthy eating habits, and find advice on raising a healthy child.
- <u>Healthy Start pre-paid card</u>: The card can be used to buy milk or infant formula, fresh or frozen fruit and vegetables for low-income pregnant women and children under 4
- Healthy Start vitamins: In Islington, ALL pregnant women, women trying to conceive, and new mums with a child under 1 can receive FREE vitamins. Children aged 3 and under can also receive free vitamins for their development. You do not have to be eligible for the Healthy Start Card to receive your free vitamins. The vitamin tablets for women contain folic acid and vitamins C and D. The drops for children contain

vitamins A, C and D. You can pick up vitamins at all 16 children's centres.
